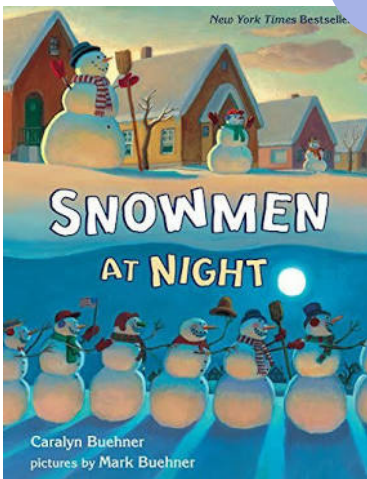

ROLL-UP PAPER SNOWMAN

MATERIALS

- White Paper Strips (2 large, 1 small)
- Black Paper Strip
- Thin Red Paper Strip
- Blue Paper
- Brown and Orange Paper
- Black Marker
- Scissors and Glue

INSTRUCTIONS

Roll each of your white paper strips into a circle. Secure with glue. Then glue them as a stack onto the blue background. Two larger rolls are the body of the snowman and the smaller roll is the head.

Roll your black paper strip into a circle. Glue the red paper strip to the bottom so it looks like a ribbon around the hat.

Glue the squared black paper oval to the top of your snowman's head (this is the brim). Glue the black paper circle vertically on top to finish the hat.

Cut your carrot nose out of the orange paper and stick arms out of the brown paper. Glue them to your snowman.

Use a black marker to add eyes, a mouth and buttons to your snowman.
